Invitations to Act

- Learn the names of your ministering individuals. Contact your quorum or organization president if you do not know your ministering assignment.
- Ponder what your covenants mean to you, including those made at baptism, renewed weekly while taking the Sacrament, and any covenants you may have made in the temple.
- Pray for guidance on how to gain a personal testimony of ministering.

Questions to Ponder

- Why has the Lord instituted a structured ministering program in His church?
- What is my role in assisting the ward to fulfill its ministering mission?
- Are there any principles to learn from the timing in which the change was made from home/visiting teaching to ministering? Invitations to Act
 - Introduce yourself to your ministering companion and ministering assignments.
 - Pray for those you are assigned to minister to specifically by name. Ask the Lord to guide your efforts to minister to them, then act in faith that your prayers will be answered by serving them.

The Savior's Example

The Savior was prepared for His ministry. "God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Ghost," and then Christ "went about doing good" (Acts 10:38). He was "full of the Holy Ghost" and was often "led by the Spirit" (Luke 4:1). Christ surely went about doing good before being anointed with the Holy Ghost, but receiving the Holy Ghost and having that right to inspiration was an important part of His ministry—just as it's an important part of ours.
